





When I was elected First Vice president, Hoo-Hoo had enjoyed a steady growth in membership for the previous few years. Little did I know that we were headed for a recession that would have devastating effect on our industry.

Today, after re-evaluating the condition of our industry and Hoo-Hoo, I believe a more realistic goal would be 8,999 for our total membership. We must have a goal. This mumber is not impossible to acheive. It means we must all concentrate on getting new members and put a real effort into getting former members to reinstate. We must also give special attention to the members who have joined in recent years. Too many of these members do not renew their membership.

Years before I became Snark, I was encouraged by numbers of my Hoo-Hoo brothers to seek this high office with the promise of their support. Now that I am Snark, I am asking each of you who encouraged me to keep your promises and support my efforts to reach our goal by working harder than ever. Not for me, but for Hoo-Hoo. By working together we can acheive our goal by the end of this Hoo-Hoo year.

As we approach the half-way point of this administrative year, let's not fool ourselves into thinking that the road form here is all down hill. It is not. We began this year highly motivated by internal conviction and external stimulation. Each of us had goals for our clubs in terms of service to the lumber industry, our community and membership growth. We are having a successful year so far in all of these categories in most clubs, but not in all of them. Now is the time for sprinkling "donkey dust." Excuses are counterproductive. It's the time for frontal attack on whatever stands in the way of meeting our goals so that the second half of this year will be better than the first.

As Hoo-Hoo, we need to rededicate ourselves to the same kind of enthusiasm that inspired the founding of our fraternity. This is not the darkness before the dawn, it is the dawn of a renaissance in Hoo-Hoo.

Our organization is made up of men who are self-motivators hailing from various facets of our great industry. Every man that we add to our membership moves our great insustry another inch in a positive direction. Our successes are measured in the hearts of those men whose lives are richer because of Hoo-Hoo's existence.

The gentleman on our front cover this issue, is Dave Davis, L-37575, Rameses No.48, and our new Seer of the House of Ancients.

Dave Davis was initiated in Hoo-Hoo in San Francisco in 1925. Together with Lew Godard and Norm Cords, both past Presidents of Oakland Hoo-Hoo Club No. 39, he helped reorganize the San Francisco Hoo-Hoo No.9 in 1945 and served as its first President. He was appointed Vicegerent Snark for 1945-46 and State Deputy Snark for Northern California for 1947-48 by Snark of the Universe LeRoy Stanton, 31930, Rameses 41.

In 1949 he was elected to the Supreme Nine as Jabberwock serving with Snark of the Universe Martin Wiegand, 44882, Rameses 42 as well as the following year of 1950-51 to Custocatian serving with Lynn Boyd, 36660, Rameses 43. At several of the National conventions he served at one time as Chairman of all the different committees.

At the 64th Annual Hoo Hoo Convention in Detroit, Michigan, September 16, 1955 Dave Davis was elected Snark of the

During his term as Snark of the Universe, 1955-56, Dave Davis visited all Jurisdictions, some several times, with a member of the Supreme Nine and Ben Springer, 34265, Rameses 37, Secretary. At this time there were over 13,000 active members in Hoo-Hoo with over 100 active clubs. It took over 50,000 miles of traveling, without any expense to Hoo-Hoo, (thanks to Simpson Timber Co.) to address over 5000 members of Hoo-Hoo with the "History and Workings of Hoo-Hoo" as well as many State Retail Lumber Conventions and the National American Wholesale

Lumber Association Convention in Vancouver, Canada.

Many new clubs were started at this time and some old ones reactivated. This was climaxed with the Annual Convention at the Fairmont Hotel. San Francisco where "The City That Knows How" held the most successful and one of largest attended Hoo-Hoo meetings: At this convention Cliff Schorling. 45533, now Rameses 49 was elected Snark.

When residing in Eureka, California, 1960-68, Dave was instrumental in helping to get Humboldt Hoo-Hoo Club No.63 to be one of the most active clubs in California. During each one of these years all the Snarks of the Universe, as well as several Rameses, visited this club for "Hoo-Hoo" Celebrity Night", at which time a Concat was held and a feed of Eureka cracked crab with all the trimmings was enjoyed.

In 1923, Dave Davis started in the lumber business in San Francisco and served the last several years as Sales Manager for some of the large redwood manufacturers.

Retiring in 1970, he is now residing at The Tamalpais, a high rise retirement residence, in Greebrae, California, a suburb of San Rafael, twelve miles north of San Francisco, across the Golden Gate bridge. Dave's wife Dottie, who contacted polio on one of the Snark's trips to Boston, is still confined to a wheel chair, but is enjoying bridge.


At the age of 76, Dave has been playing a lot of golf with a 14 handicap.




Report from Juris VI



Toronto Club No. 53 Toronto, Ont.


Toronto club 53 gathered on October 6, for the October meeting of the club.






"HOW TO RAISE KITTENS"




If you don't already know, the site of the 1981 International Hoo-Hoo Convention will be the Houston Oaks Hotel in Houston, Texas.


