

CLOSING OF CARTER HOLT HARVEY MILL AT NANGWARRY.

CHH's Future-build site was closed abruptly just before Xmas. 25 Timber workers were left without un-employment just before Xmas. The Union had negotiated improved redundancy provisions. At its peak the site employed hundreds of workers and was one of Australia's largest sawmills. Many employees had over 35 years of service. A claimed reason was a falling order book. There has been an upturn overall in our industry and the redundant employees might find employment on several sites.

The moth balled site has very secure services and would or could have major promise for alternative production processes, having a large area and many buildings and is flat.

One might assume that the old Gambier Pine site at Sturt Street in Mount Gambier will also be sold. This has laid idle for many years.

FOREST WORKER'S URGED TO RAISE THE ALARM.

A Border Watch article late in 2018 raised concerns by whistle-blowers of safety breaches in the forest products industry. Greater attention to fatigue management was needed. The Australian Forest products Association agreed that zero tolerance for any workplace safety practices was agreed with. AFPA has launched a Safe and Skilled initiative to raise awareness and to enhance employee safety in all of Australia's forest industries. A strong culture benefits all employees and the forest community. Our local industry is known to have professional practices in place.

SCIENCE FIXES NATURE"S FLAWS WITH PHOTOSYNTHESIS.

The Weekend Australian on January 5, 2019 had an amazing article about some flaws in the photosynthesis reaction, which is the basic reaction producing oxygen, and why life exists on this planet. This system developed billions of years ago but is not perfect. In warmer climates, rather than taking in carbon dioxide to produce sugars, photosynthesis goes wrong and the plant takes in oxygen instead. Instead of making food, the plant makes a toxic by-product. The wastes a huge proportion of the plant's energy. Some work on other plants such as tobacco, showed that the detoxification process could be reduced and modified plants had 40% more biomass that those not altered. University of Illinois has produced some exciting work. Cambridge University and other researchers agree with this work. Modern Science it seems can produce simply amazing results.
