COOKING TIP - We all know that in cooking "butter is better" and if correctly applied will give a superior tasting "and healthier" result than any alternative refined products.

A few tips:

Wait for butter to stop foaming before sauteing.

Why Do It: Sautéing is best done in hot fat. When foaming subsides, its an easy visual cue that the melted butter hot enough for cooking. More specially all the water in the butter continues heating and finally smokes at 250 to 300 degrees.

Slip butter under the skin of chicken.

Why Do It: Notoriously dry and chalky, roast chicken breasts can be transformed with softened – butter. Two tablespoons of unsalted butter mixed with ½ teaspoon salt spread underneath the skin of a whole breast before roasting.

Add butter before dairy in mashed potatoes.

Why Do It: If the dairy is stirred into the hot cooked potatoes before the butter, the water in the dairy will combine with the potatoes' starch, making them gummy, melted butter is added first to potatoes.

Add butter bits to uncooked eggs for omelettes.

Why Do It: Whisking a tablespoon of cold, diced butter into the eggs before cooking is the secret to a soft, creamy omelette. Without butter, the proteins in eff whites form tight, cross-linked bonds, yielding a dense, rubbery version of the French classic. But with our method, the eggs cook as the butter melts and disperses, coating the proteins and stopping them from linking.
