




It's amazing what a small, but dedicated group of people (lead by the enthusiasm of a determined Rameses) can accomplish when they set their minds to creating an adventure guests will never forget. Rameses 97 Ray Lamari and his band of merry members did just that when they rolled out the Cairns Red Carpet and invited Hoo-Hoo to where the rainforest meets the reef.

Located in the far north corner of Queensland, this tropical paradise never disappointed to provide the perfect backdrop to an excellent convention. For years Ray has been trying to convince his local members that hosting a convention would bring them rewards of new friendships beyond what they might imagine. And, I believe, he proved just that when all was said and done.

Headquartered at the lovely Pullman International Hotel, we were minutes from walking anywhere in the downtown area when convention business was not in session. Pre-convention business started on Wednesday, September 7 when the international board held their meeting. The new strategic plan they had been working on proved to be effective and on task allowing them to stay focused and power through the work of the Order in under five hours. A new record!

Thursday saw the arrival of the more conventioneers who were warmly welcomed as they checked in and got settled. As usual, it was like a giant family reunion in the lobby as friends see friends and the laughter picked up right where it left off the previous year. A lovely Ice Breaker that evening gave a chance for everyone to reunite in one place.

Following upon the theme "Where the Rainforest Meets the Reef," day trips were planned to showcase the best of this beautiful part of Australia. Convention delegates and guests spent Friday riding the Skyrail above the forest canopy on our way to the wonderful village of Kuranda. Platformed stops along the way provided an opportunity

to learn more about this vital ecosystem. In Kuranda, artisan shops and little cafes kept people busy before lunch where our keynote speaker, Thorry Gunnersen, talked about a number of Australian forestry issues. A Skyrail might have gotten us up the mountain, but a historic railroad train took us back to town offering scenic vistas along the way. Once returned, we met the Snark and his Misses at the Wool Shed, a local watering hole, for a reception with nibbles and drinks.

Official business started the following morning with the traditional presentation of flags and anthems. The HHI board, lead by Snark Kent, related news accomplished on behalf of the Order (see his article on page 10 for more on their achievements). As the morning progressed, the convention chairman saw fit to change the timetable of the day's events and moved the departure time up (by an hour) for the harbor luncheon aboard *The Spirit of Cairns*— a luxury 26m sailing catamaran. It was a delightful voyage for those who *got* the *verbal* memo, but for the five people who followed the printed schedule and were left on shore, lunch in town seemed the only option. That was until the captain turned the boat around and came back for the five slightly red-faced Black Cats. I will not name names, but the ribbing towards yours truly continued all weekend—even through my protests about having a "schedule" chiseled in Jello.

Onboard the *Spirit*, event hosts Rob Spiller and Jason Lock, plus the other members of the committee, held a rousing series of games called the *Hoo-Hoo Challenge*. Through various elimination rounds, four people remained standing for the last event—bobbing for apples in a 5-gallon bucket. Vancouver Club 48 member Jake Power proved his last name was not a fluke as he bettered the competition by plunging in and pulling out apple after apple. Impressive, to say the least.

Sunday was Great Barrier Reef Day! We left the dock (with everyone accounted for) and headed about an hour off-shore to the *Reef Magic* diving platform which is anchored on the reef. Depending on your skill level and experience, different opportunities were offered to explore these vibrant blue waters and coral splendors. Snorkeling was the option most of us chose, but for the adventurous, scuba dives could be done as well. Many of us had a chance to meet and have our picture taken with "Wally" during our time in the water. Wally is a Giant Humphead Maori Wrasse (say that three times fast) and is the resident photo bomber. His odd looking appearance and vibrant color made him especially fun, and the underwater photographer had him well trained to pose with anyone wanting a fun souvenir. For those not wanting to venture into the water, the semi-submersible reef viewer, glass bottom boat, or underwater observatory were options available to view the undersea world without getting their hair wet. It was a splendid day and the five hours we had on the reef just flew.

Monday concluded the second part of the business sessions. In true Snark Bond fashion, the meeting finished early. Installation of officers was done and was followed by the awards luncheon. Presentations had been given earlier in the convention by three clubs competing for the Club Project Award. They were: **Mount Gambier Timber Industry Club 214** which offered its Mount Gambier Railway Lands Adventure Playground Project for consideration. The entry was prepared by Brian Page 82335. **Southern California Club 117** told of their Gregson Golf Tournament which raised \$22,000 to benefit City of Hope, the Wounded Warrior Project, Homes for our Troops, and Gregson Memorial Fund. 
